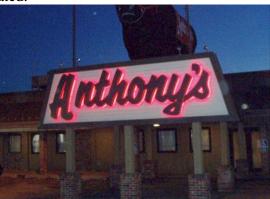
## THE ASSOCIATION HOSTS NEW 55<sup>TH</sup> WING COMMANDER
