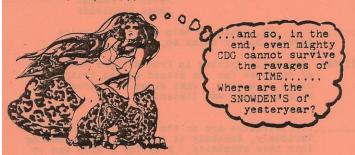

How much total TDY do you think is about right? Do you think all crews go to all TDY locations

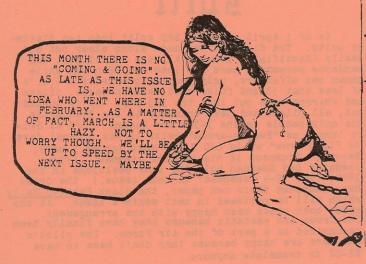
equally? (Front end only)
