FROM THE PRESIDENT

Another reunion is in the history books. **Greg** and **Julie Smith** are to be commended for their hospitality and work at putting this affair in order. One item of great interest was the low attendance. There was much constructive discussion at our meetings about possible reasons for the attendance. Many ideas were posed. Many members knew of others who were unable to attend due to family commitments, i.e.; weddings and graduations.

However, our reunions have been held during the busy times of the spring and not had the same attendance shortfalls. This time, however, the business caught up to us. We will avoid planning reunions in May and the first half of June in the future. We will again give our best efforts to deconflict from other organizations' reunions as there are so many organizations now; however, 100% deconfliction is never assured. Other suggestions will be taken under advisement as we plan for future reunions.

On the other hand, those who did attend, as usual, had a great time together. Many old

acquaintances were renewed as the album pictures will show. And most fortunately, when the final accounting was over, the contracted deficit in room nights was made up by modifying the food and beverage contract, a generous bar tab by the membership, and the generosity of friends of the **Association**.

Most reunion planning cycles allow for a year prior as a minimum deadline for a location contract to ensure availability. Not the case with Colorado Springs as it is a much desired and used convention/reunion location. **Al** and Sandy Feldcamp have stepped up to the tremendous responsibility of hosting our next reunion in Colorado Springs. Having experience hosting reunions there, Al and Sandy knew that the planning and contracting timelines start months before a year. They are well on the way to putting together a super reunion for us, September 5 - 9, 2012. There are many events and locations to visit, a possible Air Force Academy football game, and potentially, speakers we could arrange for. Our previous reunion in Colorado Springs was May 1998 and attendance was 320. I don't see any reason that we can't at least match that.

There are some items I would like to share with the membership. For two reunions now, **Larry D'Orvilliers** and **Elvio Palmieri** have endeavored to increase the participation of our enlisted **55**th veterans. I have appointed Larry and Elvio as Enlisted Affairs Liaisons with an open line to the Board of Directors on all things that would benefit our enlisted **55th** veterans. If this action does nothing but increase communications on this subject, the **Association** will benefit.

In the village of Nuthampstead, United Kingdom, there is an effort afoot to create a museum in memory of the 398th Bomb Group and the **55th Fighter Group** that served at Station 131,

Nuthampstead, during WW II. Memberships are being sold (linked to our www.55WA.org) to finance the museum. An anonymous donator has purchased a founder membership in the Nuthampstead Air Museum for the 55th Wing Association.

During 2011 the **Association** has been very fortunate. We are slowly healing financially as a result of our dues increase, and donations to the **Association** that we did not anticipate. The **Association** is grateful to those who have included extra money along with their dues payments, to the family of **Joe Gyulavics**, Calvert Systems Engineering (CSE), L-3 Communications Systems Integration, and the Ozmen Family Foundation at the Community Foundation of Western Nevada.

Finally, I would like to touch base on the bottom line for our **Association** and its future...membership. As reported herein, we have 631 members in good standing and 81 members became delinquent as of 1 April 2011. We will be contacting each one of those 81 with a personal letter to remind/ask them to come back to the **Association**.

The best I can tell you about these numbers is that 81 fallouts is less than half what it was last year, and that last year we gained back 50% of the loss. If we are lucky to do that again we will have a membership of approximately 670. That is 130 above the number of dues paying members we need to sustain the amount/cost of activities we conduct each year now. So, we call that the breakeven point in membership/dues (540).

Active duty folks are coming into the **Association** at about the same numbers as in past years. This is not sufficient for the long term, but we are holding our ground for the near term. That is where we stand with membership as I see it.

Please do not forget, **each member** is a recruiter for the **Association**. Contact a friend who you know is not a member, or someone you know has fallen off our wagon and get them back into the **Association**. Contact Mike Cook about all matters on dues and membership, Michael.Cook@Cox.net.

He also iterated his support for the organization and recognized its many continuing contributions to the Wing's missions and personnel.

MEMBERSHIP MEETING MINUTES
21 May 2011
Courtyard by Marriott Hotel, Allen, TX

The meeting was called to order by President Jim Thomas at 0905. He stated that the meeting notification was in the February 2011 **Association** newsletter, and that a quorum was present. He made opening remarks welcoming the assemblage, among other general statements.

He called upon Acting Secretary George Ross to read the minutes from the last membership meeting of 17 September 2009. George stated for the record that the subject minutes were published in the November 2009 issue of the *Videmus Omnia*, and were posted on the Association web site. Bill Ernst moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes; the motion was seconded by Jim Maloney. Motion passed.

Pres Thomas then showed a map with the location of all the current 55th Wing Association membership.

Jim then introduced BGen Don "Bits" Bacon, the 55th Wing Commander, who told those present how proud he was to again be a member of the 55th Wing. He shared his joy when he was notified that the Bacon family was being transferred to Omaha, NE. General Bacon proceeded to give the 55th Unit Mission Briefing. The 55th has continually supported the SW Asian Theater for 21 consecutive years. "The sun truly never sets on the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth!*"

Bill Lewis asked to speak to the membership to deliver a message from General (Ret) **Jack Shotts**

(former 15th Air Force Commander). His message was that during his tenure as 15th AF CC, he always considered the 55th as the "Crown Jewel" of the Air Force.

Mike Cook, Association Treasurer, gave a brief summary of the current membership status and recapped our financial status. We have 631 current and paid up members. We also carry as Newsletter Recipients-Widow (NLR-W), 170 widows. The Association has approximately \$25,000 in the bank. This is a three year layout as dues can be paid for a three year period.

Pres Thomas then recapped the **Association** actions since the last reunion in 2009. It was a busy 18 months with many significant events.

Thomas talked about the **Association** name change, the Change of Command, the success of the *Tales of the* 55th, the 55th Wing Birthday Ball, the Wing Hall of Fame, and the **Association's** Award for Excellence (Winner: **Senior Airman Enrick Earl**, a Medical Technician in the 55th Medical Group).

Jim gave a summary of the vote count for the **Association** name change. He told of how the **Association** Offutt-area members helped say farewell to

the outgoing 55th Wing Commander, BGen Jack Shanahan.

The Omaha board members then continued the **Association** tradition of welcoming the new wing commander, BGen Bacon, by hosting a dinner for him shortly after his arrival.

Jim then talked about the Heritage Week activities which included *Tales of the 55th*, the Hall of Fame announcement (Those selected were **Max Moore, Robb Hoover**, and **Mike Cook**), and the Birthday Ball. Jim then talked about the part the **Association** played in coordinating the 69th Doolittle Raider reunion, which only has five remaining participants, one of which attended this reunion.

Next, the president recognized Bill Ernst, the Nomination Committee chair, to put forth the slate for election to the Board of Directors. Ernst explained that under the recently revised **Association** Bylaws, all the directors were now elected positions. He listed the 17 nominees as: Sam Pizzo, Don Griffin, Bill Ernst, Max Moore, Robb Hoover, Errol Hoberman, Jim Thomas, Michael Cook, Ricky McMahon, Dennis Haun, Larry Utley, Jim Maloney, George Ross, Fox Censullo, Pete Glenboski, Kevin Todd, and Don Kelly.

Hoover moved the slate be accepted and that the nominations be closed. Seconded by Maloney. The

motion passed, and the nominees were elected by acclamation.

Thomas introduced **Al** and **Sandy Feldkamp** who will chair the next reunion from September 5–9, 2012 in Colorado Springs, CO. Al gave a brief overview of the Colorado Springs reunion along with the many attractions, and encouraged everyone to plan to attend. A vote by the membership was not required because the site was approved at the Reno reunion in 2009.

Pres Thomas recognized **Greg Smith** and his wife, **Julie**, for their outstanding work in setting up and running this reunion.

The Association was designated a 501c (19) tax exempt, veterans organization in 1995. In September 2009, additional information was provided the IRS about the membership and purposes and activities of the organization. Due to these changes in our membership makeup, activities and purposes, the IRS acknowledged that we are an organization of war veterans, well over 90%, and our activities and purposes qualify us under the provisions of Section 170 of the code so that donations to the Association are deductible for the purposes of federal income tax. Examples of these donations recently are cash donations from members who include extra money along with a dues payment (extra is deductible, not the dues) and donations given to the Association in memory of Joe Gyulavics, and other pending corporate donations.

The second topic centered on why we had a smaller turnout than normally expected for this year's reunion. Several ideas were openly discussed and ranged from "too many activities occur in May each year" to "the location did not have enough attractions to draw members", to "the hotel was too expensive"; the list goes on. **No solutions** were reached but the membership did discuss combining a reunion with the **55**th **Wing** Birthday Ball in the spring of 2014, and making Omaha a permanent location for every other reunion (those scheduled for the spring time).

These ideas, although favorably accepted, seemed to have as many issues as solutions and will be looked into further in the months to come. As of now, we **do not have** a location selected for the spring 2014 reunion.

Reg Urschler introduced the cadre of 55th members in attendance who were part of the 55th when it was located at Forbes.

The meeting ended with Jim Thomas thanking everyone for attending.

The meeting adjourned at 1055.

On 9 March 2011 BrigGen Donald Bacon became the 55th Wing Commander. He assumed the position from BrigGen John Shanahan who was

assigned as Deputy Director of Global Operations (J39), Joint Staff at the Pentagon, Washington, DC.

General Bacon is a former RC EWO and Chief of Protocol with the Wing at Offutt (1998-2000). He is the first EWO to hold the chair, and the first **55th** alumni to return to command since **Colonel Dan Peterson**, the first navigator to be Wing CC, in 1988. Before being rated, he was an intelligence officer; and he has been in the electronic combat units at Davis-Monthan AFB, AZ, during previous assignments.

His last assignment was Deputy Commander of 3rd Air Force at Ramstein AB, Germany.

Treasurer Michael Cook (sitting in for an ailing Pres Jim Thomas) welcomed BGen Bacon with opening remarks that included noting that the


assemblage represented over 250 accumulative years service with the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth*. Then the attendees did a round-robin of introductions of themselves.

MEMORIAL FOR A/C 664

Heritage Week 2011 for the **55th** actually began on 15 March with the 45th RS hosting a memorial ceremony to commemorate the 30th anniversary of the crash of COBRA BALL, RC-135S aircraft, tail number 664 at Shemya AFB, AK. Six crewmen

were killed in that accident during extremely poor flying conditions.



LtCol Brian Humphrey, 45th commander, welcomed the gathering with opening remarks and introductions.

Two speakers for the occasion were Kerry Crooks and Bill Maxwell who related their experiences as survivors of the incident, and remembered those who perished. Among the many guests at the occasion were four other survivors.

LTCOL STRATTON HONORED

A road just north of the General Curtis E. LeMay Building (Bldg 500) at Offutt AFB, NE, was dedicated in honor of **LtCol Mark E. Stratton II** on 26 March 2011. LtCol Stratton was killed when an improvised explosive devise detonated beside his vehicle in a convoy he was leading north of Bagram Airfield in Afghanistan on 26 May 2009.

Remarks were made by BGen Bacon, 55th Wing Commander, LtCol Humphreys, 45th RS Commander, and **Jennifer Stratton**, Mark's widow, and **Jan York**, his mother. Each lady spoke eloquently of LtCol Stratton's qualities as a son, husband and father.

LtCol Stratton served in the 55th at Offutt from 1996 to 2002. He was a senior RC navigator, IN, evaluator in the 45th RS. He was also a wing executive officer and co-chaired the 2001 Birthday Ball. He later served as the aide-de-camp to the vice commander of US STRATCOM.

He was assigned to the Pentagon when he volunteered to go to Afghanistan to lead a unit responsible for building roads and bridges in the war torn areas. LtCol Stratton was described by his peers as a dedicated patriot and a hard charger who was destined to inspire and lead others.

The 45th also dedicated a heritage room in his honor after the road ceremony. The dedications were during the 55th Wing's second annual Heritage Week.

TALES OF THE 55TH - 2011

The 12th edition of *Tales* took place on Friday, 25 March 2011. Once again Jim Thomas conducted

the program of more oral history of the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth's* heritage.

Getting underway with welcoming remarks and introductions, Thomas recognized dignitaries, members of the Hall of Fame, and the Royal Air Force 51 Squadron contingent who are at Offutt for RC-135 crew training.

BGen Bacon then opened the event with the ringing of the 55th bell, and followed with his remarks on the significance of the *Tales* and the **Association's** support of the Wing.

Thomas gave an update on monuments in the UK to the 55th Fighter Group of WWII. Memorial projects are at RAF Nuthampstead and at an abbey in Wormingford.

The Speakers

Fitz Carty, a former RC AC (who later served as the Wing vice commander) related a current event relevant tale of the original confrontation with Libya's Muammar Gadhaffi (does anyone know or care how to spell this nut job's name?).

In 1981 the dictator had declared a Line of Death across the Gulf of Sidra, which was challenged by the US Navy and with 55th recon missions.

Carty and crew were pursued by Libyan MiG fighters and had to take evasive action to include emergency decent. The thrill ride was memorable for all involved.

Hoover was up next to detail a four ship coordinated mission against Soviet defenses in 1981. Using an RC-135V, RC-135U (COMBAT SENT), SR-71 and an RAF 51 Sqd Nimrod at various altitudes, directions and timing, the Baltic Sea area of interest was 'stimulated' to great effect (to say the least) with superior electronic surveillance results. Robb had been a SAC HQ planner for the unique mission, and flew on the SENT as a staff observer.

The 55th Electronic Group Commander, **LtCol John Rye** from Davis-Monthan AFB, AZ, presented his unit's EC-130H "JAM IT" mission capabilities and operations of the recent past and currently. Another significant element in the **55**th **Wing's** arsenal.

The *Tales* closed with the traditional toast to all the deployed troops of the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth*.

Major Andy Burroughs, of the 55th Intelligence Support Sqd, and his sidekick, Capt Devin Long, of the 45th RS, led the committee to plan and execute the gala affair.



Major General James Poss was this year's guest speaker, a former commander of the 488th Intelligence Squadron, RAF Mildenhall, UK. General Poss is the Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff for Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance (ISR), HQ USAF, Pentagon, Washington, DC. His talk recounted significant eras of the 55th's history.

Dave Webber emceed the event for the fifth year in a row. He is a longtime Omaha TV personality who once served a four year hitch as a member of the SAC Elite Guard in the early 1970s.

As is the custom, the newest Hall of Fame inductees and the **Association**'s Award for Excellence were presented at the function.

After dinner and the program, there was dancing to the *Nightwing* ensemble of the Heartland of America Band until the midnight hour.

TAPS



CARBAUGH, PHILIP C., 79, died 26 May 2011, Lakewood, WA: wife Margaret Mary (**Mickey**). He joined the Air Force in 1952 and began his career as a navigator and instructed at basic nav school at Waco, TX. After a break in service, Phil became a pilot and served in

the 55th SRW at Forbes AFB, KS, in the RB-47 in the 1950s and 1960s. He later flew C-124s out of the Philippines in support of the Vietnam War before retiring in 1974.

ELZE, LEO (Butch), 70, 16 April 2011, Phoenix, AZ. Butch served in the 2ACCS battle staff as an intelligence officer at Offutt AFB, NE, in the late 1970s and early 1980s. He was a long time resident of Papillion, NE, and worked for SAIC after retiring from the AF.

GYULAVICS, JOE, 85, 9 March 2011, Winter Haven, FL. A WWII, Korean War, Cold War and Vietnam era veteran, Joe joined the **55**th **SRW** at Forbes as an RB-47 copilot in 1952. He moved with the Wing to Offutt and transitioned into the RC-135 in 1966. He later commanded the 343rd SRS at Offutt. (See article following TAPS)

JEFFERS, FRED F., 12 May 2011, Centennial, CO; wife, Frances (**Heidi**). A veteran of WWII and Korea, he flew bomber missions in Europe and in the Berlin Airlift. He was also a Cold War recon pioneer as an EWO in RB-29s/-50s at Ramey AFB, PR, and Forbes in the late 1940s and early 1950s. Fred retired from Barksdale AFB, LA, in 1961.

KRESGE, CLETUS C., 88, 20 March 2011, Alexandria, VA; wife of 63 years, Margaret. Clete was also a veteran of four wars: WWII, Korea, Cold War and Vietnam era. Clete enlisted in the Army Air Corps right after 7 December 1941. He flew B-29s in the Pacific theater and weather recon missions over Hiroshima and Nagasaki on the days the atomic bombs were dropped.

He served in the 55th from 1957-62 as an RB-47 AC at Forbes. After tours at Vandenburg AFB, CA, Maxwell AFB, AL, and the Pentagon, Clete retired in 1974.

LOUKOTA, ROBERT (Speedy) D., 76, 29 January 2011, Shalimar, FL; wife, Patricia. Bob entered the Air Force via the aviation cadet program in 1953. Two years later he was in the 55th at Forbes as an ERB-47 EWO. He later flew missions in Vietnam. Retiring in 1979, he had a second career as a systems engineer for Teledyne Engineering. Pat also is a retired AF officer.

MANLEY, FRANK D., 90, 23 January 2011, Overland Park, KS; wife of 54 years, **Joan**. Frank was assigned by The Boeing Company, to work with the **55**th **SRW** as a technical

representative at Forbes from February 1957 through June 1963. Both Frank and Joan were faithful reunion attendees, and Frank organized the Seattle reunion in August 1992. Long time residents of Bellevue, WA, they had relocated to the Kansas City area.

MARK, JOHN W., 75, 1 April 2011, Omaha, NE. He came in to the 55th SRW at Offutt in the original cadre of RC-135 crews, although, he first checked out in the RB-47 Tell Two, likely one of the last EWOs to do so. John later went to the 82nd SRS at Kadena AFB, Okinawa, circa 1972-78. He then had a tour in the SAC Recon Center at Offutt, 1978-82.

MILLER, PAUL B., 78, 7 March 2011, Seattle, WA; wife, Judith. A navigator with the 55th in RBs at Forbes and in RCs at Offutt in the 1960s and 70s. He also served on staff and had a tour at the SAC Recon Center retiring in 1975. After that, he was a commercial real estate broker in Seattle for many years.

MURPHY, JOHN J. (Jack), LtGen USAF Retired, 86, 21 March 2011, Dunedin, FL; wife, Wilma. General Murphy was commander of 15th AF in 1981-83 when the 55th was under that command. He was a good friend of the Wing and the speaker at the 1983 Wing Birthday Ball.

ROLLER, TOSHIE, 83, 13 May 2011, Bellevue, NE; wife of **Harry**, a former crew and line chief with the 55th at Offutt in the 1970s. Toshie was an accomplished chef at the NCO and Officers clubs, and in area country clubs. She later instructed Japanese at Creighton University in Omaha for several years.

RYAN, DONALD R., 82, 18 August 2010, Muskegon, MI. A native of Muskegon, Don was an RB EWO at Forbes 1955-56. He also had assignments in Germany, Japan, Okinawa, and Greenland during his 22 years in the Air Force. He later worked another 19 years as a civilian auditor for the Air Force.

SHAW, EUGENE (Gene) B., 84, 10 May 2011, Omaha, NE: wife, **Linda**. A bomb/nav in B-47s by trade, Gene served in the 55th at Offutt as a staff officer in the early 1980's. After retiring he was a GS in Plans with the 3902nd Air Base Wing.

THOMAS, BARBARA N., 89, 12 June 2011, Mendocino, CA. Devoted wife of 56 years to **Don** (**DL**), an RB-47 pilot at Forbes in the 1960s. They

regularly attended the reunions, most recently last May in Texas.

WALLER, ROBERT (**Bob**) **E.**, 82, 2 May 2011, Tulsa, OK; wife of 54 years, **Maralene**. Bob came into the **55**th at Forbes as an RB-47 pilot in the early 1950s. He participated in surveillance over flights of the Soviet Union in *Operation Homerun* in 1956. He later served as an attache' in Chile, Uruguay, Guatemala, and Panama. After retiring from the Air Force in 1982, Bob went to law school, became a practicing attorney, and eventually served as a municipal judge in Tulsa.

WEST, RUFUS H., 87, 29 June 2011, Boise, ID, former resident of Ft Walton Beach, FL. An enlisted WWII navy veteran, Rufus later graduated from the University of Alabama, then went into the Air Force as an officer and served during the Korean War. He came to the 55th as an EWO in RB-47s in the mid-1950s at Forbes. Retired in 1970.

JOE GYULAVICS (JUH-lay-vix)

Affectionately known as "Jumpin' Joe", he was a patriot, leader, mentor, and a friend to practically everyone he met. More than all that, he was a fine human being. His positive attitude and sunny disposition were infectious. He and Dottie were a team for nearly 65 years.



Joe had an interesting life and Air Force career. He had the rare experience of going through aviation cadets twice. No, he did not wash out the first time.

A native of Buffalo, NY, he joined the Army Air Corps in 1943. His first stint in the aviation cadet program trained him as a navigator as WWII ended. After demobilization, he later reenlisted in 1947 as a master sergeant, and continued to fly as an enlisted nav/bombardier/observer in B-29s with the 28th Bomb Gp at Rapid City, SD. During temporary duty to Germany and the UK, he flew in the Berlin Airlift.

Joe applied for pilot training in 1950 and was accepted into the last cadet class to take married and enlisted students. He graduated with his pilot wings and a regular commission, then was sent directly to Kadena AB, Okinawa, as a B-29 co-pilot in the 19th Bomb Gp. That unit flew combat missions during the Korean conflict.

After that tour, in 1952 he was assigned to the 55th Strategic Reconnaissance Wing at Forbes AFB, KS, as an RB-50 co-pilot. He transitioned with the Wing into the RB-47H in 1954, upgraded and got his own crew. Joe was in stand/eval as a copilot and later with his own crew. He also served as the Wing Safety Officer in 1959.

Still with the 55th as it prepared to receive RC-135 aircraft, he went to Castle AFB, CA, and checked out as a receiver and tanker pilot in the -135 and returned to Offutt AFB, NE, where the 55th had relocated in 1966. While awaiting the arrival of the new RCs, he was sent to Clark AB, PI, as a detachment commander overseeing some early Vietnam missions seeking the locations of SAMs. Back at Offutt, he flew in the Airborne Command Post for a few months until the RC-135Cs arrived.

In January 1968 he took command of the 343rd SRS, where he remained until May 1971, and was promoted to colonel without any professional military education square-filling.

Joe Leaves the 55th

After over 19 years in the 55th, Joe was then assigned as the deputy commander for operations to the 6th Strat Wing at Eielson AFB, AK, and later became the vice wing commander.

With over 10,000 flying hours, he was medically grounded and was assigned to be base commander at Glasgow AFB, MT, in 1973. Next, he was the base commander at Andersen AFB on Guam for two years, a hectic and exciting time

during the Vietnam conflict. He was so respected and involved in the entire community there that he was known as the unofficial 'mayor of Guam'.

His last assignment was to 15th AF at March AFB, CA. He retired after 35 years of service in 1978. Over 19 of those years were in the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth* in three different flying platforms, two bases and a variety of responsible crew and staff positions.

Joe and Dottie enjoyed Guam so much they returned there in retirement and stayed for over ten years, then resettled in Winter Haven, FL, in 1990. They were regulars at 55th reunions and missed just one from 1977.

Joe relished instigating songfests on those occasions. With Dottie, **John** and **Reese Drost**, he helped compose a **55**th theme song of sorts to the tune of "*Hey Look us Over*", ("the **55**th is here") at the Seattle reunion in August 1992, which, at each succeeding reunion, attendees were happily obligated to sing as Joe directed the group.

Joe also served on the **Association** Board of Directors from September 2003 until his passing.

Dottie died on 28 January, less than six weeks before Joe. Their 65th wedding anniversary would have been 11 March 2011. They celebrated it together, no doubt.

They will be sorely missed by the entire 55th family of which they were so much an integral part.
