FROM THE PRESIDENT

Greetings from the Heartland

I hope that each and every one was blessed with a joyous and restful holiday season with family and friends.

It's another slow start on the New Year here, and again with the customary arctic air mass and the accompanying near zero temps. It will not last long, however. The weather patterns have changed here



since the sixties and seventies. Winters are not as cold, dark and lengthy now. Must be that climate thing.

Planning for our next reunion is coming along nicely. The necessary basics have been locked down and are provided for your initial planning. We are returning to San Antonio after a reunion there in 1985. A lot has changed since then, but one thing has not. It's a great town to have a gathering. Lots to see and do, and as always, we have all the ingredients for another grand reunion. Nobody needs to entertain us. The **55**th brings its own party...us. Let's make it another great get together.

A topic always worthy of consideration is membership. The hard facts about our membership are within the Membership Report. The numbers each year look a bit dubious after the turn of the year. However, it has been the case so far that a majority of the delinquent members just simply forget to reup prior to the new year.

We have already started, since 1 January, getting dues paid by the tardy 183. We have been averaging about a 70% pick up rate on the delinquents. That can be, I think, honestly described as a "slow, steady leak" in the tire. Just think where we would be if half

of our membership recruited one new member, or got someone to rejoin the **Association**. We would be back to 85% of our all-time high. I know that is a tall order. But, it is fun just thinking about it.

I request all members to help us with certain individual information the **Association** needs to maintain. The **Association** is a 501(C)19 veterans organization, federal tax exempt. In order to take maximum advantage of various tax exempt provisions in the law, 95% of our members must be veterans.

We updated the membership form in 2012 to include your military service information: years of service, and in which units of the 55th you served. This is our way to maintain the best data without privacy concerns being an issue. If the IRS audits us, we can demonstrate that we gave this matter our honest attention to document our veterans, and are in compliance with the tax code. Please help us in this matter.

I am often asked by veterans of the 55th and of the Air Force. What's it like today? Are they still doing....? Often the discussion gets around to ..."It's just not the same any more" and "Boy, that's different."

Of course we have all heard the expression, "The more things change, the more they remain the same." There is one thing I know for sure, having served, retired, and now, still being a part of the 55th, one thing that has not changed for all the generations that the 55th Wing Association represents: dedication.

That story is best represented by the stained glass window in the west wall of the SAC Chapel, best



viewed from inside the chapel on a sunny day at about 1600 hrs. The story is priceless and continues for all generations.

This sacrifice and dedication continues in the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth* today where the Wing has had another

fantastic year of breaking records of service, demonstrating excellence in all challenges, and continuing to serve silently at the leading edge of history.

55TH WING COMMANDER'S YEAR END ADDRESS

Greetings Fightin' Fifty-Fifth Alumni:

22 December 2014

I am honored to address all of you as 2014 concludes. It has been a busy and successful year in the **55th Wing** as our Airmen continued to make an impact across all regions of the globe.

The need for Intelligence,



Surveillance, Reconnaissance (ISR), Command and Control (C2), and Electronic Attack in today's worldwide geopolitical environment has never been greater, and our **Wing** continues to be tasked to participate in multiple operations.

In fact, over a four-month period during the spring and summer of 2014, all seven of our aircraft types were simultaneously deployed on 57 of those days. This level of tasking for our **Wing** is unprecedented during my time here (since June 2013), and according to many of the "seasoned" Airmen in our Wing, that intensity is not something they can recall experiencing in past years.

Overall, **55th Wing** aircraft flew 4,217 sorties totaling 25,991 hours in FY2014, of which 1,126 sorties, and 9,679 hours, were combat missions in the CENTCOM Area of Responsibility (AOR), a region in which our **Wing** continues to maintain a presence for the 24th consecutive year. Our RC-135 Variants (COBRA BALL, COMBAT SENT, OPEN SKIES, and CONSTANT PHOENIX) were deployed 925 days in FY2014, encompassing 27 deployments.

In addition to maintaining 24/7 nuclear C2 support, the E-4B flew Defense Secretary **Chuck Hagel** on six missions to 18 countries. Additionally, our Electronic Combat Group Airmen at Davis-Monthan AFB, AZ, continued their presence in the CENTCOM AOR by flying 373 EC-130 COMPASS CALL combat sorties.

55th Wing Airmen were actively involved in many of the engagements you likely saw on the news this year. You may have seen one of the several news stories about foreign fighters intercepting our aircraft -- both in the Pacific and Europe. I'm sure this reminds many of you of precarious experiences during the Cold War.

I can assure you our aircrews are trained and equipped to an exceptional level, and will always take the actions necessary to ensure the safety of their aircraft and crew, while still accomplishing the mission -- just as you did with great skill and professionalism.

Recognizing that the **55th Wing** is actively engaged in operations around the world, Air Combat Command (ACC) bestowed the **55th Wing** with the Meritorious Unit Award for the two-year period, 2013-2014. This award was given to just two other ACC Wings. A hard-earned, and certainly well-deserved, accomplishment for the men and women of the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth*.

In conclusion, we are proud to carry the torch that you many of you lit and continued to fuel for over seventy years. The men and women representing the **55th Wing** today are an amazing group and continue to carry the legacy that our alumni established.

Thank you again for your teamwork and support. I hope to see many of you at the **55th Wing** Birthday Ball on 16 May 2015. Until then, have a safe and enjoyable holiday season, and an outstanding 2015.

TREASURER'S REPORT

As of 31 December 2014, the treasury had an account balance (rounded) of \$48,000.

A portion of the money in the account comes from dues paid in advance. Therefore, we must keep money in reserve for each year to which the dues applies.



Some members have paid as far ahead as 2020, 2022, and even 2024! Now that is loyalty <u>and</u> optimism, folks.

It is never too soon to renew.

Although the **Association** is solvent, we have expenses, obligations, and bills to pay, such as this

newsletter. So, please pay your dues promptly, or early and often. Thank you very much.

Remember that the Association is a non-profit IRS 501(C)19 veterans, federal tax exempt organization. As such, you may donate additional funds to the treasury, or in the memory of a comrade taking that final flight. Those donations (NOT DUES) are tax deductible under an IRS ruling for the organization. Every amount, large or small, is very much appreciated. It happens.

There have been a few requests for us to offer PayPal as a method of paying membership dues. Chartered by the Board of Directors a study was conducted into the feasibility of offering PayPal. The use of PayPal Pro would cost the **Association** \$30.00 per month plus a 2.9% + \$0.30 per transaction. Therefore, we maintain the current way of doing business. The payment of dues and any donation will be by check or cash via US Mail or in person.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT

There were 570 members in good standing as of 31 December 2014, compared with 541 on 30 May 2014, a net gain even though there were those whose dues (*or person*) expired.

Through 'friendly reminders' and such, several members have returned to the fold, including lapsed members from years past, and a few new sign-ups.

Of those 570 members, 183 members had their membership **expire** at midnight on **31 December 2014.**

Those members have until 1 April 2015 to renew. Should they opt not to renew, they will be deleted from the membership data base and directory. We hope that will be a very low number, like zero.

Retaining members, and recruiting new ones, is a recurring and never ending priority.

While not actual members, about 170 widows receive the newsletter gratis. As always, they are welcome to any and all **Association** functions.

Fifty-one **55th Wing** units and offices are sent the newsletter for PR purposes, and to keep them

connected with the **Association**. Occasionally, this effort has a payoff of exposure for the **Association** and new active duty members.

BRADY, James C., 79, 10 December 2014, Aurora, TX; wife **Retta.** After a tour in Viet Nam in EB-66s, "Diamond Jim" began his recon flying in the 6th SW at Eielson AFB, AK. Came to the **55th SRW** in the 2ACCS at Offutt AFB, NE, in 1971. He later was the pilot for the CINCSAC command crew for Gen Russ Dougherty.

BROWN, Leland D., 74, 10 August 2014, Kingman, KS. A native of Mississippi, Lee was a RB-47 EWO in the 55th SRW at Forbes AFB, KS, in the 1960s. After retiring to Kingman, he owned and operated a successful welding/manufacturing business for many years.

COFIELD, Joan, 83, 15 June 2014, Fair Oaks Ranch, TX; wife of **Ralph**, a long time **55'ther**, RB-47 EWO at Forbes, 1960s; and in RC-135s at Offutt AFB, NE, and on staff in the 1970s

DIVER, Sandra (Johnson), 72, 7 September 2014; Bellevue, NE; wife of **Carl**, a former 2ACCS battle staffer at Offutt. Sandy was an AF/**55th** wife who served at Forbes, Kadena AB, Okinawa, and Offutt. She was active in squadron activities, PTA, officer wives' clubs and her church. In Bellevue, she worked as an administrative assistant for SAIC for several years.

DROST, Mary Alice, 91, 5 June 2014, College Station, TX. "Reecie", as she was widely known, survived by **John**, they were married for nearly 70 years. The consummate AF wife, she supported his 28 year career with "grace and dignity". A long time RB pilot at Forbes, John is a **55th Wing** Hall of Fame member. Reecie served as an officer and on boards of many officer wives' clubs. She was a beloved and dedicated mentor to younger AF wives.

DUBE, Francis (Buck), 80, 29 September 2014; Bluffton, SC; wife of 39 years, **Mitzi**. Buck began his career as an RB EWO at Forbes in 1955. He was at SAC Headquarters at Offutt in 1964 and had Viet Nam tour with 7th AF. Buck had a sterling career in EWO operations at Wright-Patterson AFB, OH; at NATO HQ in Brussels, Belgium; Hanscom AFB, MA; and with Lockheed for 15 years after retiring from the AF.

JONES, Glen E., 78, 19 August 2014, Bellevue, NE. A veteran **55**th A&E maintenance man at Forbes in the 1960s, then an in-flight maintenance technician on the RCs at Offutt in the 1970s. Glen retired as a master sergeant, then worked as a technical representative for E-Systems for several years.

LARSON, Loren M., 78, 10 September 2014, Alden, IA; wife of 58 years, **Betty**. A navigator in RCs with the 82nd SRS at Kadena in the late 1960s, Loren came to the **55th SRW** at Offutt, as a crew member and was the Chief of Mission Development when he retired in 1978. He had his own insurance agency for 20 years.

LAWRENCE, Floyd E. (Gene), 79, 23 November 2014, Aurora, CO; married to **Doris** for 59 years. Gene served in the **55**th at Forbes from 1954-1964 as a bomb-navigation systems technician. An honor graduate of the NCO Academy he retired in 1977 as a Chief MSgt. He then worked for the US Postal Service until 1997.

MATHERS, Donald E., 82, 26 August 2014, Topeka, KS; married to **Rebecca** for 60 years. Don was a native Kansan who was a KC-97 navigator with the **55**th Air Refueling Sqd at Forbes, circa late 1950s, early 1960s. He later was in KC-135s, and then the SR-71 at Beale AFB, CA. Retiring to Topeka in 1979 after 24 AF years, he worked for Josten's Publishing until 1996.

MULL, Raymond L., 91, 22 August 2014, Benton Harbor, MI. A WWII P-51 pilot with the 343rd Fighter Sqd in the **55th Fighter Group**, Ray was shot down on his 13th mission and was a POW for eight months at Stalag 1 in Barth, Germany. After the war, he remained in the AF Reserves for 30 years, and was active in several veterans' organizations. Ray owned Mull Tool and Engineering Co. in Benton Harbor where he was born, raised and retired.
