55TH WING REUNION and COMPASS CALL 40TH ANNIVERSARY "The OLD PUEBLO ROUND-UP & RENDEZVOUS"

The **55th Wing Association Reunion** team has completed the COVID extended 2-year planning for the Old Pueblo Round-Up and Rendezvous. Pending any COVID lock-down it is a go! We will gather in Tucson, Arizona to celebrate a major event in the Wing's history - the 40th Anniversary of the EC-130 COMPASS Call and its upcoming transition to the EC-37B; a completely new aircraft. Supporting this anniversary celebration, the **55th** Electronic Combat Group (**55** ECG) has planned several events to highlight this auspicious event – an ECG Open House, EC-130 and RC-135 aircraft static display, and COMPASS Call Golf Tournament, culminating with the Anniversary and Reunion Banquet at the Pima Air and Space Museum hanger amid several historic aircraft.

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55TH WING WELCOMES A NEW COMMANDER

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The *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth*, the largest wing in Air Combat Command and the second largest in the Air Force, welcomed a new commander during a ceremony 22 June 2021.

Colonel Kristen Thompson assumed command of the **55th Wing** from **Colonel Gavin Marks** during the time-honored military ceremony on the historic parade grounds of Fort Crook.

"The **55th Wing** is gaining a world-class leader and commander today," said LtGen. Haugh, 16th Air Force (Air Forces Cyber) commander, the presiding official.

Col. Thompson arrives at Offutt from Al Dhafra Air Base, United Arab Emirates, where she served as the 380th Expeditionary Operations Group commander for the past year.

"I look forward to Kristen's leadership as she takes command, and I can't wait to watch the incredible Airmen of the **55th Wing** continue to advance the future of warfighting within the Air Force and the Joint Force," General Haugh said.

The new commander earned her commission from the US Air Force Academy in 2001. She is a command pilot with more than 3,800 flying hours, including more than 700 combat hours,

She is the first female to serve as commander of the **55th Wing**.

"To the men and women of the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth*, I'm so excited for this new challenge," Thompson said. "I'm big on relationships and it's how I lead and how I plan to do business."

Over her 20-year career, Col. Thompson served the Office of the Secretary of Defense as military assistant to the Under Secretary of Defense for Policy. She also commanded the 960th Airborne Air Control Squadron at Tinker AFB, OK, and served as a speechwriter in the Secretary of the Air Force's Executive Action Group.

"I am super-pumped to be part of a mission set that is undoubtedly the gem of the Air Force," she said. "It is not lost on me that the **55th Wing** is spread across the world. The reach, professionalism, determination and discipline that this **Wing** possesses and crushes daily are remarkable."

"I remember saying two years and eight days ago that (taking command) would be the honor of my life, and I was right," he said. "This experience has been surreal, exhilarating, exhausting, life fulfilling, and I cannot believe that it is coming to a close, Marks said.

Haugh awarded Marks the Legion of Merit during the ceremony for his leadership of the **Wing** through COVID-19, the runway replacement and flood recovery efforts over the past two years.

"(Gavin) definitely left his mark on the **55th Wing**," Haugh said. "He harnessed the ingenuity of the Airmen in the **Wing** to deliver exceptional outcomes to the nation."

Marks departed Offutt for the Pentagon, where he will lead the Executive Action Group for the Chief of Staff of the Air Force.

Over 300 personnel attended the event in near perfect weather. Among the several dignitaries were Nebraska Governor Pete Ricketts, US Strategic Command Chief of Staff Rear Admiral William Wheeler, Nebraska Air National Guard Commander BrigGeneral Daryl Bohac, State Senator Rita Sanders, Bellevue Mayor Rusty Hike, Plattsmouth Mayor Paul Lampert.

President Joe Spivey represented the **Association**, as did past-president **Jim Thoma**s and former wing commander **Steve Stevens**.

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55TH WING ASSN HOSTS NEW COMMANDER AND VICE

Renewing a tradition initiated by then-**Association** president **Bill Ernst** in 1997, a cadre of **Association** members hosted a welcome and get acquainted dinner with the newest commander of the *Fightin' Fifty' Fifth*, **Colonel Kristen Thompson**. She was the 14th commander so greeted.

Also invited was **Colonel Mark Howard**, Vice Commander, a former crewdog himself with prior duty with the **Wing**, here since July.

The event was held 1800 hours 16 August at the Spezia Italian steak house on 72nd Street.

After some social time, mix and mingle, when Col. Thompson got to meet some of the "Old Guard", President Spivey emceed the festivities and began with opening remarks and introductions.

Mike Hoskins noted that the date of this event coincided with the first **55** days of Col. Thompson's tenure, and marked the date **55** years ago from when the **Wing** moved from Forbes to Offutt.

It officially began with Col. Thompson and former Wing commanders BGen (Ret)/Congressman Don Bacon and Col.(Ret) Steve Stevens when were invited to ring the 55th ceremonial bell.

There was a round-robin of the attendees giving short resume's of their careers before the excellent dinners were enjoyed.

President Spivey presented Col. Thompson with a copy of the *We See All* Cold War pictorial history. She then addressed the group, and among other things, noted how impressed she was with the 55th Wing Association, and expressed her appreciation for the evening's activity.

Among the two dozen attending were some out of towners here on business, (of course). In addition to Bacon and Stevens, **Association** Board of Directors Vice President Ricky McMahon, Treasurer Michael Cook, Mo Krishna, Don Kelly, Jim Maloney, Ham Kennedy, Paul Jeanes, Val Dugie, and Max Moore were there.

Other members at the occasion were **Dick Purdum** (*last commander of the 3902nd Air Base Wing at Offutt*), Mike Hoskins, **Dave Heininger**, **Dave Wolfe**, **Denny Haun**, **Ben Ungerman**, **Jeff Johnson**, **Chris Canada**, **Brian Humphrey**, and **55th Wing Historian John McQueney**.

(As a side-bar, the chain was broken during Colonel Marks's tenure due to the COVID and myriad other circumstances that kept his schedule from being anything but normal. So we just never got him to dinner).

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VIRTUAL REALITY TRAINING ASSISTS 55TH CREWS

The **55th** Operations Group crews at Offutt are using new virtual reality (VR) equipment sent from the 16th Air Force to help them maintain their RC-135 training requirements.

Since Offutt's runway is currently under construction and students need to travel back and forth to Lincoln, the 338th Combat Crew Training Squadron is relying on the VR equipment not only for training, but also to save time and fuel.

"We are doing split operations at Lincoln, so it is more difficult to get students there," said **Col. John Litecky**, **55th** Ops Group commander. "They have about a one-and-a-half-hour bus ride each way, so this is saving us that time alone."

Before the VR system, students would have to power up an aircraft on the ground, or spend time in the air to understand the system they are now learning on the new equipment. This system will save approximately \$4 million a year in fuel alone.

"We are able to prioritize the aircraft and use it to the maximum extent possible, while the students are doing all their prep work on the ground getting it ready for a chance to see the systems virtually before they actually see it in the aircraft," Litecky said. "We are able to see the reduced amount of time on the aircraft in order for the students to become familiar with the system."

The VR system allows the students to know where safety equipment is located on the aircraft and gives them the opportunity to handle the equipment virtually. The students are able to interact with everything, including items they would not normally be allowed to touch.

"It is insane; it is awesome," said **Senior Airman Ryan Benson**, 338th CTS airborne cryptologic language analyst student. "It saves a trip to Lincoln at the benefit of being able to view the system in a way I can do my job."

Litecky believes the VR system will continue its success as the program grows and improves. "I think overall, the program is a great benefit to the **Wing** and the group," Litecky said. "We are on the cusp of seeing what it can do for us and there is a lot more opportunity that we will be able to see savings in the future as we continue to develop the program."

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AARON, Jane E., 69, 24 May 2021, Lakeville, IN; wife of **Dan**. A native Hoosier, **Janey** earned a nursing degree, but chose to raise a family and worked for Indiana Bell for several years.

BOWKER, Jean, 95, November 2020, Portland, OR; wife of **Bill** for 73 years who survives her. He was an RB-47 aircraft commander in the **55**th **Strategic Reconnaissance Wing (SRW)** at Forbes AFB, KS, in the late 1950s until 1963.

DAWES, Tom, 100 last May, 15 June 2021, Pultneyville, NY; wife **Lorraine.** He earned his navigator wings thru Aviation Cadets in 1942. During WWII he flew 22 combat missions in B-24s in the Mighty 8th Air Force. He separated in 1945 and remained in the Reserves. Recalled to active duty in June 1950, Tom was assigned to the **55th SRW** as an RB-50 navigator at Ramey AFB, PR. He then moved with the **Wing** to Forbes, and flew the RB-47 until 1964. Tom retired in 1969 after a tour as the 301st Aviation Electronics Maintenance Squadron commander at Lockbourne AFB, OH. He was an **Association** member for decades.

FORD, Phillip J., 78, 28 May 2021, McGregor, TX; married to **Kristen** for 52 years. A native Texan, commissioned thru AF OTS in 1967. Phil's first assignment after pilot training was to the 343rd at Offutt AFB,

NE, as an RC-135 pilot in September 1970 to December 1972. After numerous assignments, positions and schools, including January 1989 when he assumed the duties of Inspector General and Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations for Headquarters Strategic Air Command, Offutt AFB, NE, until May 1990, In February 1994, the General returned to US Strategic Command as the Director for Operations and Logistics until March 1996.

He then was assigned as the commander of Eighth Air Force, Barksdale AFB, LA. His last assignment was Deputy Commander of US Strategic Command at Offutt. He retired as a LtGeneral in June 2000. He was inducted into the **55**th **Wing** Hall of Fame earlier that year.

Upon retirement from the Air Force, General Ford became the General Manager/CEO of the Brazos River Authority from April 2001 to April 2018. He made a lasting impression on the water industry in Texas serving on numerous boards, and as President of the Texas Water Conservation Association.

HORNOR, Edward G. (Pops), 77, 29 July 2021; Port Angeles, WA; wife **Annie**. Pops was born in West Virginia, an Army Air Corps 'brat'. Joining the Air Force in 1966, he was a B-52 navigator before going to pilot training. Pops served in the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth* as an RC-135 pilot/instructor/evaluator in the 1970s-80s. He served a remote at Osan, South Korea, had a staff tour at RAF Mildenhall. retiring in 1989.

HICKS, Frank L, 91, 12 June 2021, Bellevue, NE. Frank served in the US Army during the Korean War, then went to AF Aviation Cadets earning his pilot wings. He was assigned to the **55**th at Forbes in August 1955 as an RB-47 co-pilot. After ten years there he transitioned to RC-135s and was an AC in the 82nd SRS at Kadena AB, Okinawa and Offutt AFB, NE.

MCCLEAN, John (Mac) N., 74, 13 May 2021, The Villages, FL.; wife of 50 years, Patricia. A New York native, Mac enlisted in the USAF at 18 and served four years as a GCI controller in Germany and Alaska. After graduating from Manhattan College, he earned an AF commission thru OTS and went to pilot training. He flew

B-52s during most of his career. He served as the vice commander of the **55th Wing**, June 2000-August 2002, when he retired.

MILLEN, Billy, 86, 20 April 2020; North Carolina; wife of 60 years, **Kathy**. He was a crew chief on RB-47s at Forbes, 1953-1957, with the **55**th **SRW**.

POTTER, Eliot H. (**Pete**), 99, 13 April 2021, Topeka, KS; married to **Treva**. Pete was a three war veteran. After graduating as a navigator from Army Air Corps aviation cadets in 1942, he flew 53 combat missions in B-25s from North Africa over Italy. He later went thru pilot training and flew 55 bombing missions in B-29s over Korea from Japan.

During the Cold War he was assigned to Roswell, NM, in B-36s. Pete came to the 55th in the early 1960s, flew the RB-47 and served as 55th OMS commander before retiring in 1965. He served as Chief of Staff for the Kansas Secretary of State for several years. He and Treva were Birthday Ball regulars. Easily spotted: ramrod tall with his gray flat top, he was the guest cake cutter twice.

RACINE, Joseph C., 84, 11 July 2021, Waterloo, IL; wife, **Mary**. An Illinois native, Joe was an RB-47 copilot in the 343rd at Forbes in the early 1960s. He separated for a long career with American Airlines. He always relished his time in the 55th, maintained many of those friendships, and was proud of his Cold War service. He kept his **Association** membership for decades. He and Mary attended the occasional Birthday Ball and reunion.
