erpetural trophy is preeach athletic year, runs from basketball o basketball season. If adron wins the trophy ears in a row, it is rmanently awarded to the squadron.

In intramural competition, evaluation of the trophy winner is done by a point system. In team sports, 50 points are awarded to each squadron fielding a team, with an additional 50, 30, 20 and 10 points earned for a first, second, third or fourth place finish in the league.

This year the 6971st accumulated 865 points while the 82nd had 825.

In individual sports like squash or handball, five points is awarded for each entrant. not to exceed four men and 25, 15, 10 and five points for first thru fourth place finishing.

This year, the 6927th Security Group finished runnerup in the large squadron while the 824th Dispensary took sec-

ond place honors in the small. The separation between small and large squadrons is made at 250 assigned and attached personnel. The assigned and attached personnel of both groups are noted at the beginning of each athletic year and remain as such for the whole year.

In varsity sports, squadrons are awarded points by the number of members from that squadron participating on a varsity team and how long they stay with the team.
