We encourage members to check it out. We think you'll like its content and appearance, ease of navigation, etc.



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# 55<sup>th</sup> WING MISSION and MODERIZATION STRATEGY

The **Wing** recently released its view of the future. The purpose is "to provide a basic overview



of the **55<sup>th</sup> Wing's** enduring missions operating the RC-135/WC-135 weapon systems and the EC-130/EC-37B Compass Call (CC) aircraft.

The statement outlines ongoing operational missions during competition, crisis and conflict phases, while profiling current modernization programs

with continuing mission improvement activities to enable and exceed Future Air Force Design needs.

The goal of all **55th Wing** programs and associated aircraft is to exceed the Chief of Staff of the Air Force's (CSAF) direction to build the USAF we need; while maintaining critical capabilities in support of foundational Intelligence Community (IC) and on-going Combatant Commanders' (CCMD) requirements and operations.

The document also provides details on USAF resources and future planning and programming efforts to ensure viability of **55th Wing** specialized R/WC-135/EC-130/37B fleets/capabilities to support evolving National Command Authority (NCA), CCMD, National Intelligence Centers (NIC) and Combat Support Agencies (CSA) needs."

### TREASURER'S REPORT

As of 15 February 2023, the treasury had an account balance (rounded) of \$49,000.

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# 55<sup>TH</sup> INTEL SUPPORT SQD OPENS RENOVATED HQ

The **55th** Intelligence Support Squadron (ISS) officially opened its new headquarters with a ribbon cutting ceremony 6 January 2023 at Offutt AFB.

The ISS headquarters facility was damaged in the March 2019 historic flood that resulted in 720 million gallons of water covering the southeastern portion of the base. The renovation took 2.5 years to accomplish at a cost of \$2.5 million.

The new headquarters is 28,000 square feet with room for roughly 330 workstations, including around 19,000 square feet of classified space. It has three watch floors, 11 offices, three conference rooms, an auditorium, **a** classroom and a recreational room.

Established in 2010, the **55th** ISS serves as the **55th** Wing's focal point for intelligence management, oversight, analysis and production. The unit has more than 250 military, civilian and contract personnel spanning 13 Air Force specialties.

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### WING'S A-STAFF MILESTONE

The **55th Wing** commemorated its A-Staff achieving initial operating capability with a celebration at the *Warhawk* Community Center on 17 January 2023.

The A-Staff is a structure used instead of the more traditional Air Force staff designations, such as groups and squadrons, to more readily identify the Air Force component staff equivalents of the corresponding J-staff functions. (Air Staff level)

The A-Staff is currently working towards achieving full operational capability into future years.

**LtCol John Donaldson** is the A3 Director (Operations) of the A-Staff.

"The A-Staff directors took a vision and quickly translated it to fit within the **55th Wing**", **Wing** Commander **Colonel Kristen Thompson** said.

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# FIGHTIN' FIFTY-FIFTY RETURNS TO PUERTO RICO

The 45<sup>th</sup> RS Wildcats' WC-135R CONSTANT PHOENIX, tail number 64-14836, and crews, began the "nuke sniffing" mission by conducting its first outside CONUS air-sampling sorties in USSOUTHCOM area during January-February 2023, staging from Luis Muñoz Marin International Airport in Puerto Rico.



The "Sniffer" has collected off the coast of South America during the past 30 years; but this is the first time in three decades the program collected so far south—essentially getting extended range and duration of collection beyond anything previously accomplished.

Aircraft #836 arrived to the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth* in July 2022, replacing the burdensome and unreliable WC-135W/C #667 and #582, with the unholy nickname, 'Lucifer's Chariot'.

Flights were "baseline" collection missions to gather air samples used to establish what atmospheric radiation levels should look like under normal conditions. 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# 55<sup>th</sup> WING AND RAF 51 SQD JOINT CREW AT RED FLAG

Aircrew personnel from the RAF Waddington based 51 Squadron, conducted integrated crew training flying during Exercise RED FLAG from Nellis AFB, NV, in February.

The Royal Air Force aircrew joined with United States Air Force **55**<sup>th</sup> **Wing** aircrew to fly an RC 135 Rivet Joint intelligence gathering aircraft as part of the exercise.



This is the first time an integrated crew has flown on the exercise in several years and is one element of the newly expanded, but longestablished, exercise.

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### 55TH AIRCRAFT ARE TAIL SAFE

In early February USAF's Material Command ordered the inspection of all -135 variant aircraft, including about 400 KC-135 tankers and the entire **55**<sup>th</sup> **Wing** fleet of RC and WC models.

The urgent target of the inspections was the "vertical terminal fitting pins". Said pins connect the tail assembly to the aircraft fuselage. Failure of

the pins can cause the tail to separate and the planes to crash.

During the first week, 24 of 90 inspected aircraft had the faulty pins.

#### None were at Offutt.

In fact all of the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifty* aircraft were cleared during the inspection. The pins in the tails were deemed safe.

Pleased they included **John Drost, Wolfgang Samuel, Bill O'Hara,** and others in the DFCS Honor Roll, and listing your DFC's, as well. I'm also honored to be in the DFCS Honor Roll.

There were two highlights in my USAF career. One was the two and half years, (1969-1972), flying with the 82<sup>nd</sup> SRS at Kadena AB, Okinawa. I flew 103 Combat Apple missions and many other China and Russia border missions. I'm proud to have been awarded the DFC and five Air Medals.

Another highlight in my career was the four years I served in the Strategic Reconnaissance Center, SAC HQ, Offutt AFB, NE. During that time I flew with the 55<sup>th</sup> for flight time requirements.

I know the many, many of us, including yourself, who flew those missions, were very proud to see this DFC Society coverage. We all flew with the very best.



Gil was a long time **55**<sup>th</sup> **Strategic Reconnaissance Wing (SRW)** navigator in RB-47s at Forbes AFB, KS, thru the 1960s, then in RC-135s at Offutt AFB, NE, and on staff the next decade. After retiring he flew with the **55**<sup>th</sup> 'alumni' group at Tulsa in a special use -135 (with US Navy on its side) under government contract.

**BACK George V.**, 85, 18 December 2022, Navarre, FL; married to **Gerrie** forever. George was an RB-47 EWO in the 343<sup>rd</sup> at Forbes. He was a member of the **LtCol Hobart Mattison's** crew

that was shot up by North Korean fighters in April 1965. They recovered successfully at Yokota AB, Japan. He moved to Offutt with the **Wing** in RCs in 1967. George also was in RCs at Kadena circa early 1970s. A talented graphic artist, he produced a three panel mural in Bldg 497, and other works of art.

**BAILEY, Bruce M.** 87, 4 December 2022, South Lake, TX; married to **Fay** for 63 years. A native of Mississippi, he went to aviation cadet training in 1956, was commissioned and then assigned to Keesler AFB, MS, for electronic warfare officer (EWO) training. His first assignment in April 1958 was to the **55**<sup>th</sup> **SRW** at Forbes in RB-47s. He was a crew dog until the **Wing** moved to Offutt in 1967. (*See following tribute article*.)

BARRETT, Donald E., 77, 25 April 2022, Indian Trail, NC. Proceeded in death by his wife 2011. He was 2<sup>nd</sup> ACCS Laura a communications officer (the other guy, besides the general officer in charge, with the activation key) on the EC-135 ABNCP (Looking Glass) battle staff at Offutt in the mid-1970s. He had strong ties to the area, having graduated in 1963 from Bellevue High School. His Offutt assignment included a one-year overlap with brother **Doug**, a 343<sup>rd</sup>/38<sup>th</sup> SRS navigator, and his wife **Lvnn**.

**BOND, Ronald M.**, 85, 5 February 2023, Bellevue, NE; married to **Suzanne** for 65 years. They met in the 6<sup>th</sup> grade. Ron served in the **55<sup>th</sup>** as a pilot in EC/RC/C-135s. He first was stationed at Offutt in 1967. After three tours in Vietnam and other duties, Ron returned to the **55<sup>th</sup>**. His last position before retiring in 1987 was with the Command Support Airlift (CSA) division as an aviator and scheduler. He then flew for the Army Corps of Engineers for 14 years and retired a second time.

**CARVER, James I., II**, 85, 13 September 2022, Columbia, MD; **Betsy** was his wife for 61 years. A native of West Virginia, he entered the Air Force in 1961 and became an EWO serving with the **55**<sup>th</sup> in RBs at Forbes, RCs at Offutt, then at Kadena. Jim also had a SE Asia tour in EB-66s at Korat AB. He had commander assignments at Mather AFB, CA, at RAF Chicksands, UK, at Kadena, and at Ft Meade, MD. He retired in 1988.

GAFFNEY, Edward J., 67, 12 January 2023, Bellevue, NE; his bride of 48 years, Mary. They met at Bellevue HS. Ed served as Chief, Recon Operations, 922<sup>nd</sup> Strat Sqd at Hellenicon AB, Greece prior to his assignment as an evaluator/instructor navigator in the 38<sup>th</sup> RS at Offutt in 1990. He subsequently was on the SAC command crew of Casey 01, 1992-95. After retirement in 1997, Ed continued his support of the 55<sup>th</sup> as a contract instructor with L3 and a systems engineer at Northrup Grumman.

**LAMBERT, Clifford E.**, 80, 15 November 2022, Rapid City, ND; married to **Kay** for 60 years. They met while attending Ball State. A native Hoosier, he entered the Air Force in 1964 and completed pilot training. After a SE Asia tour he served in the **55**<sup>th</sup> as an EC/RC pilot, and later as the assistant director of operations. After other command assignments at Ellsworth AFB, SD, and RAF Mildenhall, UK, he was the base commander at Lackland AFB, TX, when he retired in 1997.

**REED, Thomas B.**, 87, 6 June 2022, Sedalia, CO; married to **Celia** for 58 years. They were wed in Topeka. Tom was an RB-47 navigator in the 343rd at Forbes during the 1960s. He moved with 55<sup>th</sup> to Offutt serving as an RC nav, then staff officer. Tom became an intel officer with a tour in Germany, then at Beale AFB, CA, and as an instructor at Lowry AFB, CO. After retiring from the Air Force, he continued in that capacity with Lockheed Martin until retiring again.

# BRUCE BAILEY A TRIBUTE IN TWO PARTS

(AKA: WING AND ASSOCIATION HISTORY) PART ONE

LtCol Bruce M. Bailey, USAF Retired, served 12 years in the 55<sup>th</sup> SRW. After nine years as an RB-47 EWO at Forbes, he relocated with the Wing to Offutt before the new RC-135C models arrived. He did have a six month 'break' to work on

construction and testing of the special use RC-135E, "Lisa Ann."

**Colonel William (Bill) Riggs**, then serving as wing commander at Lincoln AFB, NE, was hand-picked by the SAC DO, to lead and oversee the transition of the **55th** in location,



aircraft, personnel and mission. Bruce was the Wing Logistics Officer (Col Riggs' right hand man) during this phase.

There was no "grand plan" by SAC, nor the 3902<sup>nd</sup> Air Base Group at Offutt, for this monumental tasking. Col Riggs, his staff, and Bailey literally had to elbow their way in and scrounge for nearly everything – space, materials, furniture, etc. Their main job was to prepare facilities for the new aircraft and the crews.

With no aircraft to fly, the crew members were dispersed across the 3902<sup>nd</sup> and other units in 'attached' duties to earn their pay and keep them occupied, as it were.

Here are Bruce's (edited) words from April 2021: Wing HQ "was in Bldg 497 along with nearly everything else. It was terribly crowded and inefficient. Colonel Riggs shared an office with operations. I was building and modifying like mad all over the base.

The need for a **Wing** HQ was (clearly) evident. I had to run everything through the base  $(3902^{nd})$  and SAC HQ for approval.

They turned down our proposal and all looked lost. But I found a regulation that permitted going around SAC directly to USAF HQ.

With Colpnel Riggs' okay, I built a strong case for a (55<sup>th</sup> Wing) HQ and it came back immediately approved. I made a lot of enemies in SAC HQ and the (3902<sup>nd</sup>) air base group.

They stayed on my case from then on, making approval an unreal nightmare on all future projects.

Colonel Ted Crouchly (3902nd CC) and I had a big showdown over the HQ building when the SAC brass came to see the new building."

Once the main logistics tasks were done, and the newly-minted RCs arrived, Bruce was back as a Raven 1 EWO on the new RC-135Cs.

When the Electronic Recon Branch was established within the **Wing**, Bruce was on its

initial staff. He served there until, again in Bruce's words: "Colonel Riggs could no longer fend off a barrage of overseas assignments with (my name on them)."

He transferred to the 4252nd Strategic Wing at Kadena AB, Okinawa, in 1970. His assignment was in the Intelligence Division supporting the RC-135M COMBAT APPLE missions, and the SAC SR-71 program. The connection with the 55<sup>th</sup> continued as its aircraft and crews regularly deployed to the island.

Bruce's next assignment in 1974 was with the 100th Strat Recon Wing at Davis-Monthan, AZ (not then under the 55th) still in strategic reconnaissance operations with the U-2 and DC-130 aircraft missions.

He retired in 1976 and returned to Mississippi in the family business.

#### **PART TWO**

In retirement he found he could stay connected with his former **Wing** through the organization of EWO alumni and its periodic reunions.

The **Association** began in the late 1960s as an informal, loose-knit group of retired former **55**<sup>th</sup> **Strategic Reconnaissance Wing (SRW)** RB-50, RB-47 electronic warfare officers (EWOs) who had been stationed together over a period of years. Bruce was an active and influential member of the group from its inception.

Initially, the organization was called the 55<sup>th</sup> **ELINT Association** due to the nature of its membership made up primarily of former EWOs (Ravens, Crows).

The "founding father" was Colonel (USAF-Retired) **Bob Dibbell**, a pilot by trade, who acted as president, secretary/treasurer, newsletter editor, et al. In short, a one-man board of directors for nearly 30 years.

Bruce, who had been the **Association**'s exofficio historian, took the helm in 1991 when Bob 'retired'. Again, a one-man BoD. His tenure saw the membership grow in numbers and included more pilots and navigators, and the reunions got bigger.

It became evident over time that the organization needed a more official structure and governance, (and future name changes to indicate inclusiveness) and Bruce's dedication laid the foundation.

He stepped down in 1994 in favor of an *ad hoc* committee of volunteer members who planned the incorporation and bylaws for what evolved into what is now the **55**<sup>th</sup> **Wing Association**.

While attending reunions, the telling of tales ("There I was...."), viewing memorabilia and scrapbooks, etc., he decided someone needed to collect and preserve as much of the *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth* history as possible. That someone was him.

That led to his writing of two history books and numerous articles for aviation, historical and technical publications.

He also wrote (under a nom de plume) a novel loosely based on an RB-47 deployment to Incirlik AB, Turkey in 1962.

But the real gem and result of that mission, vision and dedication was a pictorial history volume titled **WE SEE ALL**, the **55<sup>th</sup>**'s long standing motto.

Over a three year period of planning, research, gathering materials, making layouts, writing text, and toil, Bruce procured a personal loan and self-published 1500 copies of the book in 1982.

Eventually sales and demand for the book slowed and Bruce donated the remainder of his inventory to the **Association**.

**Association** presidents have presented copies to every new wing commander and other dignitaries since the mid-1980s.

The tome also has become a collector's item for aviation and recon history buffs.

The complete work is now available for viewing on the rejuvenated **Association** web site (55wa.org). Bruce Bailey's legacy lives on.

### WE SEE ALL - THE SEQUEL

The **55<sup>th</sup> Wing Association** is spearheading an effort to produce a follow-on volume to Bruce Bailey's *We See All*, now a rare hard copy item, but available for free (donations accepted) in the BX as a PDF.

Most veteran **55thers** know Bruce privately published his book in 1982, which covered the strat recon missions from 1946 through the transition to RC-135s, and the move of the **55**<sup>th</sup> from Forbes AFB, KS. to Offutt AFB, NE. in 1966-67.

The new book will pick up the story in the late 1960s and bring it up to the present.

Tentatively titled *Videmus Omnia:* 80 Years at the Front, the book is being edited by the new web master, Dave Connaughton, pilot of the 82<sup>nd</sup> SRS, the cartoonist who created the crew cartoons that appear on the web site BX page.

Dave edited the *Dodo*, a humor newsletter at USAFA, and the *Harbus* newspaper at Harvard Business School.

The material, we hope, will come from you! To contribute, please review the draft (which will be continuously updated on the web site) and submit suggestions, photos, and articles to support@55wa.org.

Specifically: Does anyone have any info on the **55**<sup>th</sup> operations in Grenada 1983, Panama 1989-90, Kosovo 1998-99, or Open Skies 1989-2020?

We have stories in Memory Lane for many air bases, but I would appreciate facts, dates, people, stories for Offutt, Shemya, Thule, RAF Mildenhall, Kadena, Eielson, RAF Upper Heyford, Incirlik, and Souda Bay.

### FIGHTIN' FIFTY-FIFTH MURAL

(This article was originally published in the August 2018 issue of **Videmus Omnia** to educate members about a 'lost' part of the history of Bldg 497 and George Back's artistry. It is re-entered here to honor George's dedicated work. Max)

\* \* \* \* \*

The three panel mural once resided on the south wall of the briefing room in Bldg 497, which at the time was occupied by the 343<sup>rd</sup> SRS and the recon

operations directorate (DOR) secured area.

As noted previously, it was the work of Captain **George Back**.

(*In photo at left*)

His recollection is that he created it in the spring of 1967, not long after the 55th SRW had moved from Forbes AFB, KS, to Offutt. It was done of his

own volition and during off duty time (mostly).


Three plywood panels covered in canvas were laid out on the floor. The panels were each eight feet high and four feet wide, and in full color ("the paint had maybe some beer mixed in.").



The center panel depicted *Fightin' Fifty-Fifth* aircraft from different eras (P-51, P-38, RB-50, RB-47, RC-135), flying from the various operating locations around the globe during WWII and the Cold War, all under the **55**<sup>th</sup> **Strategic Reconnaissance Wing** globe and camera shield, and the motto ribbon, "*Videmus Omnia*" (*Latin for We See All*).



The left panel displayed an RC-135C over what was then SAC Headquarters, Bldg 500, at Offutt AFB, NE, then named for **General Curtis E. LeMay**. (Now the Colonel William E. Riggs Bldg, 55<sup>th</sup> Wing HO.)



Another RC in the right panel represented the operational aspect of the 55<sup>th</sup> global reconnaissance mission. The checkerboard design is emblematic of the Cold War "chess games", and with the sleepy-eyed crow and a variety of electronic targets as chess pieces. (All photos from George Back)

(This editor witnessed the removal of the mural's three panels when Bldg 497 was undergoing renovation, circa 1988, after over 20 years in place.

The plan at the time was to send them to the SAC Museum, which was at the north end of Offutt then. However, now, no one seems to know what actually happened to them, and the panels are in the black hole of wherever.

Members of the **Association** have made multiple inquiries and diligent searches of the mural's whereabouts over the years, but to no avail.

It is shameful that such an historic work of art is lost.)

If any readers have credible knowledge on the paintings location, we would be most grateful to learn of it.

# 55<sup>th</sup> WING AIRCRAFT TAIL #4133 TO UNDERGO YET ANOTHER MODIFICATIOIN

Boeing TC-135W (serial 62-4133) is pictured under darkness at Offutt AFB, NE, before departing for Greeneville-Majors Airport, TX, to join the USAF's Big Safari Program on 14 February, where

it will be reassigned and redesignated as an NC-135 platform.



The aircraft was flown to Texas by members of the 238th Combat Training Squadron, which will become responsible for the <u>testing</u> of surveillance equipment modifications, which, if successful, will be added to the USAF's leet of RC-135S/U/V/W reconnaissance aircraft at Offutt.

This is not the first time that 62-4133 has been operated in a test role since it completed its maiden flight in July 1962. In 1967, the aircraft was redesignated as an EC-135B when it received a 10ft radome nose extension, and was fitted with equipment from the EC-135N Apollo Range Instrument Aircraft (ARIA).

It was then converted into a TC-135S in 1985 and served as a training aircraft for the RC-135S Cobra Ball fleet. At that time, those aircraft did not have the 'chipmunk cheeks' fitted to the forward fuselage that is a synonymous feature of the RC-135 fleet today. Until now, the aircraft had served as part of the 45th Reconnaissance Squadron at Offutt in this same role.

Aircraft 62-4133 will take over the Big Safari test role from NC-135W (serial 61-2666), which has been responsible for testing equipment for the RC-135 fleet since the mid-1990s. That aircraft – which is the sole remaining C-135 in the USAF inventory equipped with Pratt & Whitney TF-33 turbofan engines – will be retired once 62-4133 becomes fully available.

Its retirement follows a series of divestments of a similar nature, including the two OC-135B Open Skies aircraft, and the WC-135C/W Constant Phoenix fleet, which was used for atmospheric testing and collection purposes.

The introduction of 62-4133 as the new NC-135 test aircraft will bring the Big Safari Program in line with the remainder of the fleet.

In 2019, 62-4127 became the first aircraft to have 'Baseline Charlie' installed, which was the fleet-wide glass cockpit modification. This was the first sign of alternatives to 61-2666 being used to test RC-135 fleet modifications.


