Needless to say, the tension was broken immediately. Even Rafferty laughed, which didn't happen too often.

Gene rendered a beautiful painting of the Tell-Two departing Incirlik in the rain on a collection mission. The painting has been donated to the 55h Wing and is being displayed in a prominent place depicting the wing's history of a now relatively unknown and forgotten mission.
