

LtColonel Frederick H. Bohmfalk, USAF retired, passed away on August, 28, 2019, in San Rafael, California. Fred was born on December 12, 1937, in Red Bluff, California, to Homer and Mary Annette Bohmfalk. While a student at San Jose State University (SJSU), Fred was accepted into the Air Force Reserve Officers Training Corp (ROTC). He completed his Masters of Administration in Management from the University of Southern California. Beyond his professional work, Fred was actively involved in his community.
