AGING SWINEMASTER OF HOG HENGE STOPS STAFF ONSLAUGHT

In a precedent-setting decision, Queen Elizabeth and Headquarters NATO invited the 306th Wing Commander at Mildenhall RAFB to exercise final approving authority on Offutt staff assistance visits to Mildenhall.

Visits will now be coordinated one fiscal year prior to arrival. Requests will use the new General Request for Officers Visiting England or Lambo (GROVEL) message format. Approved GROVELs will be forwarded to UK Air Defense for further coordination with Bloodhound and Rapier units.

306th INV recently developed a sensor enabling Bloodhound and Rapier units to detect unauthorized staff officers. Although technical details are sketchy, the device is known to be able to detect flight suit patches.
